




QQ oodies The first order of hoodies has gone in. Students may still order but I cannot guarantee they will be here for Christmas now.

The hoodies are black, and will have the Academy logo embroidered on the front and the Academy name embroidered on the back (hence why they take time to do). They are


ideal for students to wear over their doboks to and from training, as well as to wear at tournaments etc. Please note: Hoodies are replacing track suits which are discontin-

DVD Blurb reads: This 2nd DVD in the series contains the requirements for each grading, from 6th Kup to 3rd Kup.



Sections includes relevant patterns (demonstrated from both front and side views, as well as in slow motion), step sparring (both 2 & 1 step), semi-free sparring, free


