tudent of the Month: Sushil Puni




shortly. Well done to everyone.

Full results will be on the web site much to ask I don't think - by the way, I'm not iust speaking to the students here, but also the **PARENTS** as the younger students rely on you to fill out their forms, ensure their entry is paid and to get them there



So, as I KNOW the benefits and wish my students to also gain those benefits, from now on competitions will be compulsory for all students of 6th kup and higher. This is how it works: ALL students of 6th kup and above, will be required to enter and compete at, at least one of every 2 tournaments the Academy enters, failure to do so without a very good reason (namely holiday or ill-health) will mean you may lose your eligibility to grade at the next grading. There is a big problem when students end up at higher ranks without hardly ever having competed, as they lack the same level of experience of their peers that do, which shows in their all round confidence. Its an even bigger issue as they approach red and then black belt levels with only 1 or two tournaments under their belts, when they should have at least 10 by then!

Parents vou need to do your bit as well, if you cannot make it please allow your child to go with another's parent (as the black belts cannot keep an eye on them due to officiating all day). I am happy to liaise between parents and I'm sure you can do the same for another on the next occasion. free.

Parents that are going, please offer to be a guardian of one or two other young competitors, to allow them to compete as you will be there anyway, that way we may actually be able to get reasonable numbers along.

This rule applies to all students, 6th kup and higher and under 30 years old - many clubs already have such a rule but aren't so lenient and simply say all events! **SO**, I will be expecting entries from anyone who wishes to grade in December who




